BRICC Wellness Centre – Longest Line of Coins

The BFUA Board of Directors is pleased to announce that the association will be supporting the **Ballarat Regional Integrated Cancer Centre** & the associated **Wellness Centre** in an attempt to break the Guinness world record for the longest line of coins. The record is currently held by a community in Austria of 75km in 2011.
